### **A Practical Guide to Crib 5 Compliance & Commercial Upholstery Considerations**

When selecting seating for commercial interiors such as restaurants, cafés, hotels, offices, schools and public environments, fire safety compliance should never be overlooked.

From booth seating and banquette seating through to dining chairs, lounge furniture and waiting area seating, specifying the correct upholstery and foam materials is essential for safety, insurance compliance and long-term durability within public-use spaces.

This guide provides a straightforward overview of Crib 5 regulations, commercial upholstery requirements, common mistakes to avoid, and the key questions every buyer should ask before purchasing hospitality seating.

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### **Section 1 — What Is Crib 5?**

Crib 5 refers to a fire safety standard commonly required for upholstered furniture used within commercial and public environments across the UK.

More specifically, it relates to the ignition resistance requirements outlined under the Furniture and Furnishings (Fire) (Safety) Regulations and BS 5852 testing standards. In commercial furniture applications, seating is often tested against an ignition source known as “Crib 5”.

In practical terms, Crib 5 compliant seating is designed to better resist ignition from sources such as matches, cigarettes, and small open flames.

This is particularly important in environments with:

- High public footfall
- Hospitality use
- Schools or educational settings
- Hotels and accommodation spaces
- Offices and waiting areas
- Restaurants, cafés and bars

Commercial upholstery materials, contract-grade foams and fire-retardant interliners are typically used together to help achieve compliance.

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### **Section 2 — Where Crib 5 Is Typically Required**

#### **Restaurants**

Restaurants commonly require Crib 5 compliant booth seating, banquette seating, dining chairs and lounge seating due to constant public use and insurance requirements.

#### **Cafés & Coffee Shops**

Cafés often use upholstered seating within compact, high-traffic environments where commercial-grade durability and fire safety are both essential.

### **Hotels & Hospitality Venues**

Hotels, bars, lounges and hospitality venues typically require contract furniture that meets commercial upholstery fire regulations throughout guest and public areas.

### **Offices & Workplace Interiors**

Modern office environments increasingly include upholstered breakout seating, acoustic booths and meeting pods that require contract-grade upholstery specifications.

### **Schools, Colleges & Universities**

Educational spaces frequently require durable commercial seating with compliant upholstery and easy-clean finishes suitable for heavy daily use.

### **Public Spaces**

Libraries, reception areas, healthcare environments, waiting rooms and community buildings often require fire-compliant seating suitable for public-access environments.

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## **Section 3 — Commercial Seating Compliance Checklist**

Before purchasing commercial seating, it is important to confirm that the furniture is genuinely suitable for hospitality or public-use environments.

Use the checklist below when comparing suppliers or specifying seating for projects.

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## Section 4 — Common Mistakes To Avoid

### Using Domestic Furniture Commercially

One of the most common issues within hospitality interiors is the use of domestic furniture within commercial environments.

While residential furniture may appear visually suitable, it is often not manufactured to withstand:

- Heavy daily commercial use
- Hospitality cleaning products
- Public-space safety requirements
- Commercial fire compliance standards

Domestic furniture can deteriorate quickly in restaurants, cafés and hotels, leading to increased replacement costs and potential compliance concerns.

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### Lack of Certification Documentation

Some furniture suppliers may claim products are “commercial quality” without providing proper documentation or compliance confirmation.

Always request:

- Fabric specifications
- Fire certification details
- Foam compliance information
- Written confirmation of suitability for commercial use

Proper documentation can be important for insurance, fit-out approvals and future due diligence.

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### Using Non-Contract Fabrics

Not all upholstery fabrics are suitable for hospitality use.

Residential fabrics may:

- Wear prematurely
- Be difficult to clean

- Lack commercial fire resistance
- Fade or damage more easily

Contract-grade upholstery fabrics are specifically designed for demanding commercial environments and are generally more durable and easier to maintain.

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### **Imported Uncertified Seating**

Low-cost imported seating can sometimes arrive without clear compliance information or verified testing documentation.

This creates risks for:

- Hospitality operators
- Interior designers
- Contractors
- Architects and specifiers

When sourcing commercial furniture, it is important to confirm that products meet relevant UK commercial standards and that certification can be provided where necessary.

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## **Section 5 — Questions To Ask Seating Suppliers**

Choosing the right commercial seating supplier goes beyond appearance and price.

The questions below can help buyers, designers and hospitality operators make more informed decisions.

### **Fire Safety & Compliance Questions**

#### **Is the upholstery Crib 5 compliant?**

Request confirmation that the upholstery materials meet relevant commercial fire safety standards.

#### **Can certification documentation be provided?**

A reputable commercial furniture supplier should be able to provide supporting compliance information where applicable.

#### **Are the foams contract-grade?**

Commercial-grade foams are designed for durability, safety and heavy-use environments.

#### **Is this seating suitable for hospitality use?**

Always confirm the intended application of the furniture before ordering.

#### **Are the fabrics designed for commercial environments?**

Contract fabrics are typically more durable, easier to maintain and better suited to high-footfall use.

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## **Manufacturing & Durability Questions**

### **What type of frame construction is used?**

Heavy-duty hardwood or reinforced commercial frames are often preferable for hospitality seating.

### **Is the seating made to order?**

Made-to-order seating can often provide better flexibility for layouts, sizing and upholstery specification.

### **Is replacement upholstery or refurbishment available?**

Long-term support can be valuable for hospitality venues looking to maintain interiors over time.

### **Has the supplier worked on commercial projects before?**

Experience within hospitality, workplace or education sectors can be an important indicator of reliability and product suitability.
